Reception


We wanted to update you on the exciting learning experiences that your child has been engaging in this term in the Reception class. Our focus has been on exploring the theme of "People Who Help Us" in our community. This unit is allowing the children to develop a deeper understanding of the roles and responsibilities of individuals who play a vital role in our society.

One of the stories we have explored is "The Jolly Postman." Through this story, the children have learned about the important role of a postman and the tasks they undertake. They have been using their phonics knowledge to write simple letters to their loved ones. The children are thrilled to have the opportunity to walk to the nearest postbox and post their letters themselves. This hands-on experience has brought the learning to life and has created a sense of excitement among the children.

In addition to the postman, we have also delved into the role of firefighters. The children have learned about the firefighter's uniform, the skills required to be a firefighter, and the equipment found on a fire engine. They have enjoyed dressing up and engaging in role-playing activities, where they have simulated different fire scenarios. The children have also learned the emergency service number, further enhancing their understanding of the importance of firefighters in our community. One particularly enjoyable activity was creating a fire engine using edible materials such as Crackbread, red icing, brown sticks, and Oreo's. This activity not only allowed the children to be creative but also provided a delicious treat for them to enjoy.

In mathematics, our focus has been on place values up to 10. The children have been actively involved in sorting objects, creating different amounts, and practicing writing numerals and words. They have also been counting forward and backward, as well as exploring the concept of "1 more" and "1 less." These activities have helped to develop their number sense and foundational math skills.

Overall, the Reception class has been actively engaged in a range of fun and educational activities centered around the theme of "People Who Help Us." These experiences are allowing the children to develop a deeper understanding of the roles and responsibilities of individuals in our community. We are delighted to see their enthusiasm and engagement in their learning.



Year 1

Students in Year 1 are learning about fairy tales. They have read, sequenced, and retold several different well known stories. Children have created and described their own fairy characters, as well as, described their own setting for a fairy tale.

In Maths, Year 1 children are developing their place value and number sense skills. They are learning to find 10 more and 10 less, to partition numbers, and to find numbers on a number line. In addition, children are developing their understanding of tens and ones.

In our other subjects this week:


In history, Year 1 studied Richard III and William the Conqueror. In science, children were introduced to materials. In geography, they explored the geography of Scotland, creating posters for the capital city of Edinburgh.

Questions to ask your child:


- Describe the fictional characters in the stories that they read at home. Is it a human, animal, or imaginary creature?
- What is the name of the current king of England? Can you name a previous king or queen?
- How many countries are in the UK? Can you name all four?



Year 2



In Year 2 English this week, we've been diving into the world of suffixes using the story 'Lila and the Secret of Rain.' The children have been really enjoying it and feeling confident using suffixes! In Maths, our focus has been on division. Every day, we're seeing improvement, and the children are becoming more confident. They're even starting to make connections between multiplication! In our exciting Science lessons this term, we have been exploring everyday materials and learning all about what objects are made of and what their properties are.



Year 3

In Year 3 this week we have covered the topic of Subtraction in Maths, knowing when to use certain methods. We have written stories based on the work of Michael Foreman and linked our History and Geography topics (Local History, The UK) to our production of Oliver. We were very excited to be given our parts on Monday! We also visited Brent Library - we love looking at what's on offer and debating which books to choose.

In Years 3 & 4, we have been concentrating on Latin verbs this week. We learned that in order to understand, who did the action, in a sentence, we must look at the endings of the verb. Based on our knowledge of verbs, we went onto construct simple Latin sentences. Children are learning to look at how Latin sentences are structured. Furthermore, we are making comparisons with how English sentences are structured.

Greek Myths form a very important part of any Latin lesson. This week and next week, we will be learning and completing work around the story of Daedalus & Icarus.




Year 4

In Year 4 this week the children have been working through multiplication and division questions in Maths. It is great to see them develop their confidence. In English they have been revising their grammar and features of recounts to write their own recounts of past experiences. Year 4 have been very excited in receiving their parts for Oliver! and they thoroughly enjoyed the movie which helped them to understand their character and the plot.

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


Year 5

This week, there has been great excitement as we have given out the scripts and the parts for our Year 3, 4 & 5 production of 'Oliver'. Year 5 are all delighted with their parts and have lots of lines to learn between them. They are all very eager to get rehearsals started!

Naturally, this does not take our focus away from the 11+ Preparation and, this week, we have focused on our 11+ comprehension skills for different texts, as well as doing an 11+ Maths paper under exam conditions, as well as practicing our non-verbal reasoning skills.

In French, Year 5 have been revising their parts of the body and will soon be doing a conversation at the doctor's talking about their ailments. They have been singing the head, shoulders, knees and toes song in French too.




Year 6

In English, we have been studying The Highwayman poem to further our understanding of making stories with conflict and atmosphere.

In Maths, we have been working on place value and number. This week we have been working to understand the reasons why operations with negative numbers don't behave in the same way as they do as operations with positive numbers.

In French, Year 6 are learning to describe themselves and others. They started with gender, height, eyes and hair colour. They will also be learning adjectives to describe their personalities. They are working towards producing a poster for a wanted person.

Categories:


- Early Years






