Reception





It has been a busy and engaging week filled with various activities and learning experiences in Reception.. In our "Understanding the World" topic, we focused on safety. As part of Safety Week, we discussed different aspects of safety, with a particular emphasis on the green cross code. We talked about how to cross the road safely and sequenced pictures to understand the steps involved. To put this knowledge into practice, we went outside and followed a road crossing sheet, practicing crossing the road safely and identifying potential dangers and safe points. The children thoroughly enjoyed this hands-on experience, which helped reinforce the importance of road safety.

On our creative table, we have been busy making weaving Valentine's Day paper craft and writing messages independently for our loved ones. The children loved expressing their creativity and personalizing their crafts. This week, we also celebrated Mental Health Week. We discussed the importance of mental health and explained it in simple terms to the children. Through role-playing scenarios and watching video clips, we explored what makes us happy. The children completed a sheet on what makes them happy, allowing them to express themselves and articulate what brings them joy. This activity helped them develop emotional regulation skills and promoted positive mental well-being. In honor of Chinese New Year, we celebrated the Year of the Dragon. The children explored traditional decorations and learned about the cultural significance of Chinese New Year. They used their imagination to create their own dragons, engaging their creativity and learning about different cultures.

In English, we focused on understanding the roles and responsibilities of various professionals such as dentists, teachers, bus drivers, and lollipop ladies. This tied in well with our discussions on road safety and crossing the road safely. In Math's, we introduced subtraction this week. The children have been using mathematical language and tools such as number lines and manipulatives to carry out simple subtraction problems. The lessons have been practical and hands-on, allowing the children to develop a solid understanding of subtraction skills.

In French, children have continued to learn about farm animals. Scan the QR code and have a listen. The benefits of these activities and learning experiences are numerous. By focusing on road safety, the children are developing vital life skills and learning how to keep themselves safe. The creative Valentine's Day crafts promote self-expression and creativity, fostering a sense of pride and accomplishment. Exploring mental health and happiness helps the children develop emotional literacy and learn how to regulate their emotions. Celebrating Chinese New Year introduces them to different cultures and encourages respect and appreciation for diversity. This week in Year 1, students concluded their unit on fairytales. They chose their favourite fairytale and rewrote the story in their own words.


In Maths, students have been working on adding and subtracting any number within 100 with multiples of 10. They have also focused on improving their mental maths and have completed several challenges this week.

In other areas:

In History, the children have learned about Henry VIII and his six wives. In Geography, they have continued their study of Wales and explored the significance of Caernarfon Castle. In science, they have used describing words to describe different objects and their materials.



This week has been filled with exciting learning opportunities and collaborative efforts across Year 2!




In Science, Year 2 have been looking at materials and their properties. The children actively contributed to our Science working wall by adding materials they found in our classroom. Using scientific vocabulary, they described the properties of these materials.

In History, Year 2 continued to work on our research project focusing on our school's rich history. This week, they took a step further by immersing themselves in a project book about Buxlow created by a former pupil in 1992! They were able to use valuable information from this book to add to their booklets.









In French, Year 3 have been learning to name items of stationery. They recorded a description of their pencil case. Scan the QR code to hear some of their audios.

In Maths, we learned several hints and tips to make working with fractions

easier. To find fractions of amounts - "divide by the denominator and multiply by the numerator!"

In English, we have been writing poems for the 'Once Upon A Dream' competition. There are some very strange and entertaining dreams in our class...

Other highlights include getting TWO books on our library trip (owing to the timing of half term), completing some beautiful double page spreads on the history of London, and the realisation in Geography that counties are not the same thing as countries...



In French, Year 4 learned to order a pancake and toppings. La Chandeleur (French pancake day) is celebrated on the 2nd February in France.

In Maths, Year 4 have been working on challenging word problems ipairs and using the strategies to solve them.

English has been very interesting this week focusing on the features of newspaper articles. The children have looked at many articles and worked together to find similarities and what needs to be included when writing an article.

It was Mental Health Week this week and in PSHEE we looked at what is mental health and strategies we can use to improve our mental health. It was wonderful to see the children discuss lots of different ways to be positive.

The children are looking forward to their trip to the National Gallery on the first day back after half term with Year 3 – Monday 19th February.








This week we had a PSHE lesson where we reflected on the goals and ambitions that we had set ourselves in September and are displayed on our *Tree of Ambition*. We discussed what we had achieved, or not, and if anything had changed. In the same way that trees evolve, and blossom grows, we then wrote our new ambitions onto blossom for our tree.

In geography, we have been looking at mountains and where they are located in the world. We then each chose a different mountain to research and to design an informative fact-file poster about it. We shared our posters with the rest of the class, and you can see Aayan's here, about Mt Fuji in Japan.


In Year 6, we have spent the week wrapping up our various Foundation subject units.

In English, we are nearing the completion of our poetry unit. We have looked at various poems such as the Highwayman and High Flight to help us think about creating poems evoking strong emotions, such as eerieness and exhilaration. This culminated into our poems for the Young Writers Poetry Competition.


In Maths, we are finishing our unit on four operations with reasoning questions about the structure and the logic of written multiplication and division methods. Take a look at some of our questions – can you justify your answer?

In History, Geography and Science, we are writing our own arguments to answer our guiding unit questions: "Could the great powers have gotten along?" In History, "What will the UK landscape look like in 100 years?" In Geography, and "What will an arctic creature evolve into?" In Science. This last one is very exciting as it will lead into our upcoming field trip to the Natural History museum on Tuesday the 20th once we are back from half-term!

We have also spent time working on our entries for a digital art competition. Take a look at some of our work!

Latin

This week, Years 3 & 4 have been developing their understanding of Latin verbs. They learned to understand that in Latin, the ending of the verb tells us who is doing the action. The children responded very well and began to make links with French and Italian languages, which they are also learning in school.

To consolidate their learning, the children completed some written exercises on what they had they learned about verbs, during the lesson.

Years 5 & 6 have been learning about what life was like in Pompeii in the first century AD. and what it was like before the Eruption. This week, the children were learning about Mount Vesuvius before the Eruption. The children have been given the opportunity to watch a video on the Eruption of Mount Vesuvius, including a video on what Pompeii was like after the disaster. After the half - term, the children will be asked to write an essay on:

"The Lost City of Pompeii AD 79."

Eco Council

This half term in Eco Council we are planning fundraisers for the second half of the year. These funds will be split between Eco projects to support the school and environmental charities. Keep an eye out for more information!

BIODIVERSITY



- Each class will... appoint an Eco Monitor whose job it is to check the class bird feeder and re-fill when necessary (with teacher support where needed). They will also help ensure that the class and school plants are watered.
- The Eco Council will... purchase bee friendly plants for outside the school building, and an indoor plant for each class.
- Some classes will... produce QR codes and labels describing the types
 of trees and plants around the school site.






