We are delighted to share the exciting activities that took place in our English lessons this week. Our focus on the story of "The Enormous Turnip" has not only captured the children's imagination but has also helped them enhance their vocabulary and sentence structure. By exploring alternative words for "enormous" and discussing action words related to the story, the children have shown great progress in their language development. These activities have not only improved their reading and writing skills but have also encouraged creativity in their storytelling.

In Math's, our pupils made significant progress as we transitioned from bonding numbers to 5 to 10. By utilizing manipulatives and engaging in practical lessons, the children were able to solidify their understanding of numbers and numerical relationships. This hands-on approach to learning has allowed the students to develop a strong foundation in mathematical concepts.

The science experiment of 'Growing a Balloon Turnip' was a highlight for our young scientists this week. 

Understanding the World

This week in Reception we have been learning about Ramadan. Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. Most Muslims fast between dawn and sunset. Fasting allows Muslims to devote themselves to their faith. It is thought to teach self-discipline and reminds them of the poor and those in needs. During Ramadan, it is common to have one meal (known as the Suhoor) just before dawn and another (known as Iftar) directly after sunset. Dates are usually eaten when breaking the fast. It is a month to appreciate everything you are blessed with. It is time for prayer and good deeds. We spend time with family and friends and help people in need. Many Muslims will read the Quran and will also attend services in Mosques where the Quran is read.

During this special time, the Reception children engaged in various experiences that allowed them to explore and understand the significance of this blessed month.

- -Listening to Story about Ramadan: The children had the opportunity to listen to a story that introduced them to the traditions and practices of Ramadan. This helped them learn about the importance of this month in the Islamic faith.
- -Exploring Relevant Props: The class had a hands-on experience exploring props commonly used during Ramadan. This sensory activity enabled the children to connect with the cultural aspects of the month and understand its significance.
- -Tasting Dates: The children had the chance to taste dates, a traditional and symbolic food often consumed to break the fast-during Ramadan. This sensory experience allowed them to appreciate the cultural significance of the food and learn about its importance during the month.
- -Wearing Special Clothing: The children had the opportunity to wear special clothing worn during Ramadan. This activity helped them understand the cultural practices associated with the month and appreciate the diversity of traditions.
- -Creating a Stencil of a Mosque: The children engaged in a creative activity where they made stencils of mosques. This artistic expression allowed them to visualise and appreciate the architecture and significance of mosques in the Islamic faith.

This week in year 1, children learned about Ramadan. They read a story about what Ramadan is, how Muslims celebrate it, and why it is important in Islam. They also had the opportunity to taste dates and look at various objects associated with the celebration. In English, children wrote their own informative books about a chosen animal, considering facts about diet, habitat, and characteristics. In maths, children continued their studying of multiplication, learning about the 10s and 5s times tables.

This week in English, the Year 2 students have used their research on polar bears to craft comprehensive fact files. They meticulously selected subheadings to investigate and have produced intriguing information about these majestic creatures!

In Maths, our focus has been on height and measurement techniques using rulers. They have been working hard to use key terms like "shorter than" and "taller than" to ensure that we understand the concept. Year 2 have enjoyed measuring various objects and discerning their heights!

Meanwhile, in Design and Technology, they have been working on an exciting project around vehicle design. Soon, they will be incorporating wheels and axles into their creations. Year 2 are bursting with excitement to show you their work!



This week Year 3 have been focusing heavily on Oliver rehearsals, ensuring that they are team players by working to support all members of the cast with the timing and delivery of their lines, as well as being a good audience! They have also begun to practice a range of LAMDA poems, and will participate in a poetry performance competition with these next Thursday.

Plenty of other learning has also taken place, with our Maths focus this week being on Statistics, especially the problem solving element of reading charts. We have also produced some excellent speeches attempting to persuade Mrs McLelland that in future, Year 3s should be allowed to attend a residential trip. We're dying to know if they'll work!

Finally, we received the amazing news that we have all been selected to be in the next Young Writers book! Well done to all – consent forms have gone home for your approval.





Year 4 thoroughly enjoyed World Book Day last week expressing views about their favourite characters and most-loved books.

This week in Maths we continued our work on fractions working through some misconceptions in adding and subtracting fractions.

In English, Year 4 have been working on selecting and analysing a poem for the poetry competition next week. They are developing their delivery of the poem using expressions.

In Geography, Year 4 have been getting familiar using the atlas. They identified and described the 7 continents and used the atlas to find countries in each continent.

It was the last lesson for RE on Buddhism this week. To complete the topic the children researched the important symbols and their meanings.






On Wednesday, Year 5 and 6 had a fantastic trip to the National Gallery. When we arrived, we were met by an art historian who talked to us about the symbolism in Hans Holbein's painting 'The Ambassadors', which was very interesting and we learnt so many facts. Afterwards, Mr Hamilton-Turner talked to us about how to spot things in paintings to help tell us; what's going on, how old it is, as well as some of the tricks Renaissance artists used to create bright colours and incredible effects. After lunch, we had a workshop with one of the gallery assistants who talked to the children about movement in paintings and how that was created. The children also learnt how to build up a drawing from a number of different sketches that they did, as well as using carbon paper to combine outline drawings that they had each done. The children worked very hard and it was a fun and interesting








We have had a very busy week in Year 6.

In Maths, we conducted a series of investigations into factors, multiples, squares and prime numbers. One such investigation consisted of a series of lights that lit up according to specific mathematical rules. Our task was to find the smallest number that would light up all the lights at the same time and explain why it was the smallest one. It was a great way to practise working systematically, create and confirm conjectures, and practise number knowledge. Four of our mathletes were also invited to an ILG maths competition this Friday to represent Buxlow! They had a tournament style quiz as well as some of their own investigations as well. Ms Stanton was very impressed with how well they conducted themselves


We are finishing our newspaper articles this week, and we spent some time acting like journalists. Mr Smith role played various characters from Denmark, and the students were tasked to collect quotes for their upcoming story about the German invasion of Denmark in WW2. The students started to appreciate how tough a job it is to be a journalist as they rushed to write down the quotes they needed!

In Geography, we extended our knowledge of demographics to explore how the demographics of London are distributed. We looked through census data of Brent from 2021 as well as live maps of the entirety of London to explore where different demographic groups are clustered.

Finally, we had a great field trip with Year 5, visiting the National Art Gallery on Wednesday. Mr Hamilton-Turner showed off his impressive art history knowledge in the morning, and in the afternoon we attended a fascinating workshop called "Move" that helped us develop some artistic instincts.




