## Reception

Science Day: The Science Day was a fantastic opportunity for all children to collaborate and explore various scientific concepts. In the Reception class, the "See&Eat a beanstalk" activity allowed the children to learn about plant growth and the life cycle of a bean. By actively participating in preparing the bean and documenting its growth, the children are developing their understanding of biology and patience as they wait for the germination process. This hands-on experience fosters a sense of curiosity and scientific inquiry.

The cola and Mentos experiment was not only entertaining but also educational. By engaging in this experiment, the children learned about chemical reactions, the properties of gases, and the scientific method. Encouraging your children to explain the experiment will further enhance their communication and critical thinking skills.

## Reception Cont.d



**Understanding the World:** Exploring Easter traditions through creating cards, baskets, and Easter egg rice crisp cakes provides a creative outlet for the children. These activities promote artistic expression, fine motor skills, and cultural awareness. Additionally, working on these projects together fosters a sense of community and cooperation among the children.

**English:** The children collaborated to create a story map together of 'The Enormous Turnip', incorporating key words to enrich their understanding of storytelling elements. They then independently sequenced the story and confidently retold it to their peers using their story map and props. This engaging task not only encouraged creativity and collaboration but also promoted language development and storytelling abilities.

Throughout the week, the children have been encouraged to write independently using keywords and visual aids for support. By retelling the story in their own words and writing parts of it each day, the children have displayed impressive confidence and independence in expressing their thoughts and ideas on paper with minimal support.

**Maths:** Consolidating the concepts of 2D and 3D shapes, comparing numbers, and bonding numbers to 5 and 10 reinforces the children's mathematical understanding. These activities promote critical thinking, problem-solving, and numeracy skills. Building a strong mathematical foundation at a young age will benefit the children in their academic journey.

As we approach the Easter break, we hope that you recognize the value of these activities in your children's educational and personal growth. Wishing you all a joyful and restful Easter break filled with happiness and family moments.

Science Day: For science day, students in year 1 were split up into different groups with children from other year groups. They completed various science inspired activities. In the year 1 classroom, students learned about the different layers of soil and created cups of edible soil.

Barbican: Year 1 went on a trip to the Barbican this week to listen to "Musical Mechanics", a wonderful classical music concert. They really enjoyed the concert and

We spent the remainder of the week learning about the Easter story in RE, consolidating our times tables knowledge, exploring lifecycles and writing descriptive narratives.

Additionally, they took part in National Poetry Day, in which the whole school took part. Our very own Kaashini won the competition.








# Eco Council


They were particularly excited that the letters came from The House of Commons!


